Building Research at MU

- Externally sponsored research totaled \$191M in FY 06-07 (+8.4%)
- Second highest growth rate in federal research in the AAU (60 U.S. institutions)
- Ranks 11th in nation in NSF life sciences funding
- Brings in average of \$3.5M outside research funds every week to Missouri
- Attracts 72% of federal research dollars flowing to MO public higher education

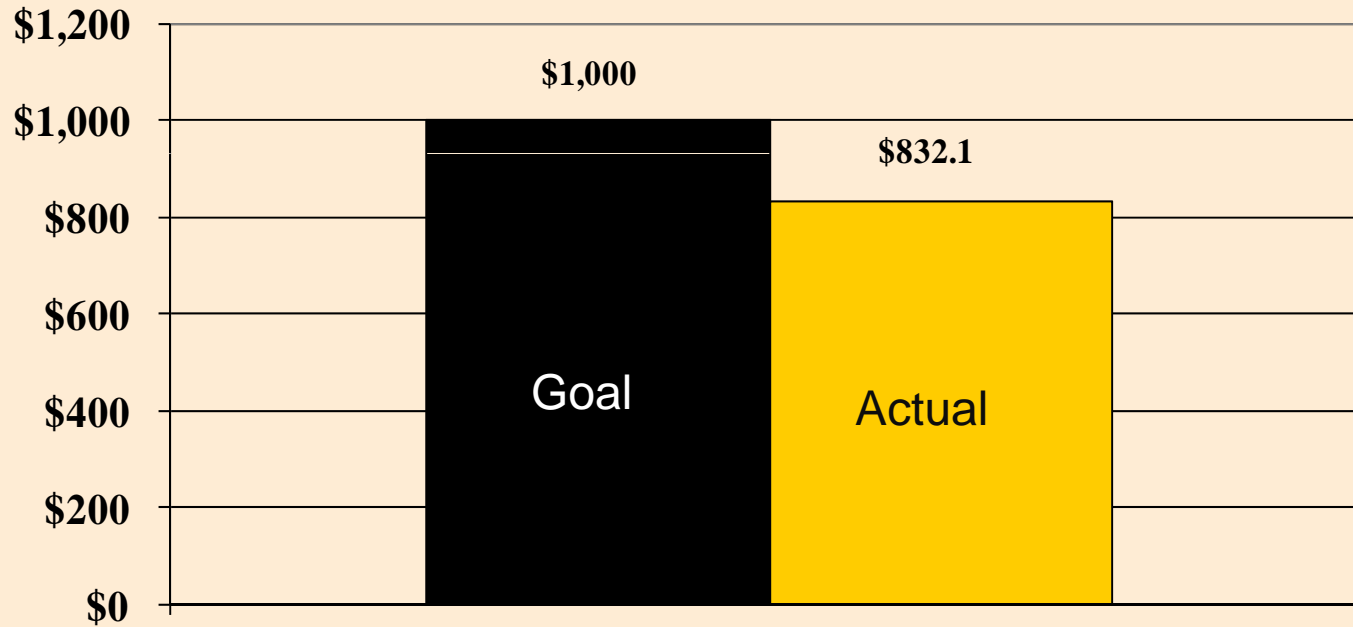

AAU International Policy

- Development and maintenance of robust study abroad programs to expose American undergraduate, graduate and professional students to language, culture, public policy and challenges of societies across the globe
- Creation of student, staff and faculty exchanges in education, research, and service
- Building human and institutional capacity in universities, nongovernmental organizations, and other institutions, particularly in developing countries
- Commitment to innovative approaches to intellectual property management to enable and encourage joint research and development activities with colleagues at international universities
- Working with associations representing higher education institutions in other countries to build goals, strategies and tactics to achieve mutual objectives.
- Influencing American federal policies, procedures and funding strategies in support of international education and discovery
- Encouraging all American research universities to build internationalization activities into institutional strategic plans.



Study Abroad

- Numbers reached all-time high of 848 in 2006-2007
- Campus-wide support for study abroad programming has increased



Academic Highlights

- College of Business Study Abroad Programs
 - Countries: Ireland, China, Czech Republic, Italy, Spain, Australia, Costa Rica, England, France
 - Gain international competencies, cross-cultural values
- MU's study abroad participation has increased by 58% over the past 5 years
 - 60 countries and 400 programs participating
- In 2006-2007-848 participants in the program at MU



Global Collaboration and Research

- Environmental Energy Technology Office (ENTECH) established in Beijing
- PIRE (Partnership for International Research and Education) grant of \$2.16 million from NSF to study earthquakes in China and Missouri
- 2006-2007 faculty-led research efforts accounted for \$20 million in international-related projects



International Faculty Development

- Global Scholars grants have supported 160 faculty since the program's inception
- In 2007, five faculty studied in India and three in Chile/Argentina as Global Scholars
- European Union Center Fellows Start Up Grants were awarded to twelve faculty in 2006-2007
- Global Scholars help internationalize the curriculum



Technical and Humanitarian Endeavors

- School of Medicine coordinated \$4.2 million HIV/AIDS research in South Africa
- CAFNR managed \$6+ million effort in Darfur Region, Sudan
- Engineering Faculty help to re-establish sites for three cities in Peru after earthquake



South Africa Relationship

- 20 -Year Project with University of Western Cape in South Africa
- 95 MU faculty and administrators have visited the University of Western Cape
- MU researcher awarded \$4.2 million to conduct research to combat HIV/AIDS



Economic Impact: MU and Columbia

- International activities infused over \$312 million into MU and Columbia between 2002 and 2007
- Tuition income helped sustain academic program offerings
- Local expenditures benefited several sectors including housing, auto and transportation; banking, food, health and recreation
